Safety concerns on our North East Roads have yet to be addressed

Since my election, I have rarely been out of the Transport Minister's mailbox, demanding action on roads and junctions in our region. At First Minister's Questions, I have repeatedly called on the Scottish Government to deliver on its decade-long promise and upgrade the A96. Tragically, in the last year, there have been many more serious accidents and fatalities on our North East roads.

Despite my search for answers, the Scottish Government confirmed plans to dual the A90 between Ellon and Peterhead had been abandoned, and the publication of a review into dualling the A96 delayed for a third time. Sadly, no action will be taken to prevent flooding on the A90 Muchalls bends, and I am still waiting to receive the results of the A90 Tipperty safety study and a timeline for work or

upgrading the Toll of Birness.

I will continue to seek action to ensure the safety of our roads in the North East.

Holyrood, away from the Chamber and official duties



Away from the more formal aspects of Parliament, there are many other things I do as an MSP. Such as, playing for the Parliament football team. I try my best! The Parliament Choir, an eclectic bunch, is a tonic to daily business. My position as an MSP also helps to facilitate school and youth organisation visits to the Scottish Parliament.

It was a huge pleasure to welcome Mannofield Explorer Scouts to the Parliament in September. After a very early start for the group, they toured the Parliament, sat in the public gallery, and watched a fiery First Minister's Questions. Over lunch, they asked me some particularly probing questions about my life as an MSP. To top it off, the troop welcomed their newest members with an investiture ceremony in the Garden Lobby.

Net Zero, Energy and Transport scrutiny continues

Although I was appointed as Shadow Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills in June, I will miss my Net Zero, Energy and Transport brief. It was a privilege and an honour to meet and learn from so many skilled people and businesses in these vital sectors.

I will, of course, continue to defend the tens of thousands of jobs in our Oil & Gas sector, and hold the Scottish Government to account by highlighting serious concerns I have with their new energy strategy.

Scrutinising Education is a Priority

In June 2023, I was delighted to be appointed as Shadow Cabinet Secretary for Education & Skills. Education is a devolved matter to Scotland, and with this new brief I joined the Scottish Parliament's Education, Children and Young People's committee.

Part of my role involves scrutinising the policies and actions of the Scottish Government relating to Education & Skills, such as raising concerns about the lack of policy in the Scottish Government's Programme for Government, and seeking answers - why do so many experienced teachers leave the profession early, why has university and college funding been cut, and why there are so few places for Scottish students studying in Scotland.

Petition to reopen Cove and Newtonhill Railway Stations



In June, I launched a petition to reopen Cove and Newtonhill railway stations. With a growing population to the south of Aberdeen, bringing rail services directly to Cove and Newtonhill would bring enormous benefit to these communities, improving connectivity and helping to reduce congestion on local roads. The support so far for reopening Cove and Newtonhill stations has been fantastic and has highlighted just how strong the public feel about this key community issue. I have been blown away, with over 1500 constituents signing and making their voice heard. Of course, any plans that come to pass would need to carefully consider location of the stations, coupled with parking and other public transport such as bus provision.

For too long, the Scottish Government has favoured the central belt on infrastructure projects, where we have seen new train stations open. I'm determined to make sure the North East has a voice for rail infrastructure, and I'm extremely grateful for the number of signatures gathered so far. I would like to encourage anyone who supports the reopening of these stations to sign the petition, which I plan to present to Parliament later in the year.

I also had the pleasure of being invited along to Shirlaws to have a look at the newest motorbike in the fleet for NERVS (North East Rider Volunteers Scotland). This is a charity whose objective is to provide a free transportation service to the Health Service.

I look forward to meeting as many of you as possible over the coming months. If your matter is pressing, please don't hesitate to get in touch. I will always do my best to help.


